


Brockville Museum | Scavenger Hunt: Water Street E

Brockville's waterfront was once full of factories, not condominiums and parks like it is today. Use this 1946 map of the area (a fire insurance plan) to explore the Centeen Park area and learn more about Brockville's history!



Where did the ferry that was once at the end of Ferry Street take passengers? Head along the waterfront trail just past the end of the street, there you will find a plague with the answer!



Besides Brockville, where else did George Chaffey live? (Note: there are 2 places) Find the large blue and gold plaque near the water to learn more about this notable Brockvillian.



What was William Parkin's profession? Spot the blue plaque on the house that acknowledges the history of the property, recognized by Heritage Brockville. Hint: located on the corner of Water and Orchard Streets. (Please respect private property and stay on the sidewalk)



There is a flag pole at the Rowing Club; who does it honour? There is a plaque at the foot of the pole.



This park was once known as Waterworks Park because the city's Waterworks was located here.

During what years was the Waterworks on this site? The original stone building is gone, but you can can find a picture of if on a historic plaque near Water Street in the park.



True or False: There was once a railway line that ran from **Blockhouse Island along Water Street East?** Find the Heritage Plague on the North side of the Street with an areal photograph of this area and use the map for clues.



What is the street address of the condominium building now located on the former Libbey, **McNeil & Libbey "Condensed** Milk Factory" site? Head along Water Street and use the map to find the spot.



How much money did the 1966 **Teenagers Mass March make for** improvements to this park? Find the stone monument near Water Street that celebrates Canada's Centennial (1967) to find the answer.



From the Market Street East side, how many storeys is the **Wedgewood Retirement Residence?** The Wedgewood is built on the former site of the Hotel Manitonna, a large hotel built in 1929. Bonus: How many painted fish can you see from this spot?
